The Sound of Music

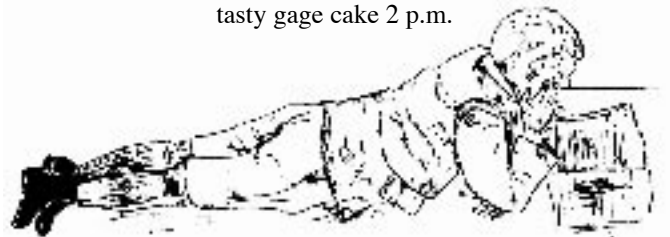
